We recently started our first "worship series" together. It's quite possible that this is a new term for you. What is your wild millennial pastor thinking? What is a "worship series?" Why are we doing these? Great questions.

To briefly answer that, I'll start off with another question. When you were in school, did it ever feel like your teacher just repeated the same lesson or saying over and over? That's because as human beings we rarely understand anything the first time we hear it. We don't really know how to live something out until we hear it a few times. Worship series help keep us focused on one central idea for several weeks so that we can understand that central theme more. It gives space for the Holy Spirit to work as the topic marinades in our minds and hearts.

Second, worship series allow us to be on a journey together for an extended period of time. Worship Design Expert Marcia McFee compares worship series to being at an artist's curated show of the work. When you go to an artist's gallery, there will be multiple pieces of art, but they all have a common theme. This allows us to progress through a common story together. We might have different interpretations of the work, but we're on the same journey and speaking a similar language.

Third, worship series also allows for more variety and spontaneity to speak into what is going on in the life of our world and our congregations. Certainly, as the pastor, I am the chief visionary to do this discernment. But I desire to do it with you and to design series that will be of greatest benefit for you. Worship series allow us to design worship with the guest in mind during seasons when guests are most likely to visit (AKA after Christmas and Easter).

Finally and perhaps most importantly, it's about using the full story of Scripture. If we're honest, there are some parts of the Bible that we'd prefer weren't there. Sometimes, certain series will be needed to dive into those parts of the Bible that are unfamiliar to us so that we can get a more full picture of who God is and calls us to be.

So, where do you need growth in your spiritual life? What are you desiring to learn about? Let me know! I am on the journey with you, and I'm grateful you are with me.
